At the 10:00 AM service, our Middle School Sunday scholars will recite the Lord’s Prayer in Greek and Spanish, in commemoration of the moment of “hearing in tongues.”

If you would like to receive communion, please come forward to the altar rail, will place a wafer of bread on your hand. You may eat the bread and take a sip of wine from the cup that the chalice will bring to you. If you would prefer, you may let the chalice dip the bread in the wine and place it on your tongue.

*If you are not able to come up the steps to the altar rail, please have an usher or a neighbor tell the priest and communion will be brought to you. **Gluten Free wafers are now available.***
